What is Sport's Premium?

The government announced funding to support the delivery of PE and School Sport. Through the previous success of the School Sports Partnership programme and a commitment to ensure continued standards of delivery in PE and School Sport, there is a desire to continue to provide a coordinated level of support to enhance the delivery of PE and School Sport. The government funding is ring fenced only to be spent on sport. The outcome is to improve teaching & learning.

The aims of the new primary school sport funding are:

- To increase participation in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics
- To increase and have success in competitive school sports
- For the physical education curriculum to become more inclusive
- To grow the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities
- To improve the partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners
- To improve links with other subjects that contribute to pupil's overall achievement and greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- To have greater awareness amongst pupils' about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other activities that undermine pupils' health

How is the Funding Spent?

The aim of the funding is to improve the quality and breadth of our PE and sporting provision and to meet this criteria we have identified a number of key priorities, which include; investing in continual professional development for our staff; increasing the competitive opportunities available to all pupils'; working in partnerships with other schools to share expertise and resources and offering new and varied sporting opportunities for our pupils.

Summary of Sports Premium Spending 2014-15

In our school we are using this funding in the following ways:-

- Increase the amount of competitive sport our children participate in
 - To buy in a specialist coach to lead PE lessons and support, develop and up-skill the teaching staff through Burton Albion Community Trust
 - To increase the diversity and range of additional clubs which will strengthen and embed the skills taught in the curriculum
 - To supplement the lunchtime games and sports offered including training our Young Leaders and the implementation of the Change for Life Programme
 - To provide the transportation to attend sporting competitions and festivals
 - To provide weekly swimming lessons for all pupils in Y2, Y3 Y4
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Impact of Sports Premium Spending 2014 -15

- Sainsburys School Game Silver Award achieved (Bronze level was awarded in 2013 -14)
 - Increased participation in inter-school competitions – 100% of KS2 pupils participated in a range of tournaments
 - Specialist coaching has bought in high quality and more varied PE curriculum
 - PLT has attended termly network meetings with all schools and CPD opportunities offered by Castele Consultancy
 - Maintenance of 2 hours of timetabled physical activity per week with additional activities offered after school and at lunchtime
 - Sports Council has been introduced who organise and report on sporting events. Their blog entries on the School Games Website resulted in a prize from the Youth Sport Trust in Spring term 2015.
 - All Y4 pupils leave this school as competent swimmers
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
